the Missouri Council of the Blind. Participants were to write about how Braille has affected their lives. The essay was to be 400-500 words, written in Braille, using a slate and stylus or a Per-

kins Braille. Submissions were judged based on content, originality, formatting, grammar and punctuation.

MSB student, Zyshaun Cross-Williams, won first place and was awarded \$500, in addition to an all expenses paid trip to the MCB Convention in Kansas City. In addition, two other MSB students, Damon Tyson and James Rodgers, each won a \$50 prize in the runner up category.
