Grunig wins Outstanding Wrestler NCASB Award

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




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For the first time in thirteen years, an MSB wrestler returned home with the Outstanding Wrestler Award from the North Central Association of Schools for the Blind (NCASB) Conference wrestling and cheer meet. Neil Grunig, an 8th grader at MSB, won both the Outstanding wrestler award and 1st place in the 106-pound weight class on January 20, 2018, at Wisconsin School for the Blind and Visually Impaired. The last MSB wrestler to win the Outstanding Wrestler award was Darwin Above: Grunig with Out-May in the 2003-04 season.





Not only is this Neil's first season on the MSB team, this NCASB conference meet is only his second time ever wrestling. He enrolled at MSB just this past December, midway through the wrestling season, and had only been to one meet, in Indiana, in which he lost his match. Following that experience, Neil worked hard in practice to develop the skills he would soon use to amaze the coaches, athletic directors and other wrestlers at the NCASB conference meet. Every year, the Outstanding Wrestler recipient is chosen through a vote by wrestling coaches from all the conference schools attending the meet. Each team can nominate up to three wrestlers from any NCASB school for the award, and the wrestler with the most votes wins. Neil's abrupt success at the NCASB meet impressed so many coaches that he won the majority of the votes this year.

Furthermore, Neil's success contributed to the MSB wrestling team winning 2nd place overall. In addition to Neil's win, his teammates all placed as well. Nicole Motley and Kiwan Sanders took 1st and 2nd respectively in their weight class, Malikye Baston, took 3rd in his weight class, and Chloe Deremiah took 6th in her weight class. The cheer team also competed at this meet and won 4th in the team competition, with Nautica Wheeler placing 5th in the Outstanding Cheerleader contest.

MSB hosts Goalball conference, Mules take 3rd and 4th Place




